

HIGH MEANS DUI STATE LAWS SUMMARY



WASHINGTON STATE (2012)

- It is not lawful to operate a motor vehicle with a level of five nanograms per milliliter of tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) in the blood, as detected by a blood draw.
- For a first offense, punishment includes suspension of the license for 90 days (even before conviction) and fines, which vary by court. If a driver is convicted, that license suspension could extend to up to four years. Conditions to get it back vary, possibly including drug rehab classes, court fines and licensing reissue fees.
